Some of our students have learning disabilities, are dyslexic or have emotional issues that require special attention. Very limited funds follow the students to our school. # The Church



Holy Trinity Episcopal Church was built in the colony of Chetwynd, now Fruitland Park, in December of 1888. The 'Citrus Rush' brought a group of mostly English settlers looking to make their fortune by planting citrus groves in the area. The devastating Great Freeze of 1894-95 decimated the groves and many of the residents fled in panic. Thanks to the perseverance of a handful of pioneering families, Holy Trinity stayed open and has remained an active church to this day. The entire building, inside and out, is made of yellow pine in a gothic design often called "Florida" or "carpenter" gothic. Holy Trinity Episcopal Church was officially listed on The National Register of Historic Places on June 26, 1975.
