Todd Pittenger has been married for 32 years, has three college-age children and has made his home in Orlando since graduating from the law school at University of North Carolina in 1988. Pittenger is a lifelong Episcopalian who was baptized and confirmed at All Saints, Winter Park. He became an Episcopal "preacher's kid" in sixth grade when his late father, The Rev. Their grandfather baptized all three of Pittenger's children at St. Mary's, Stuart, where he served as rector from 1991 until retirement. At St. Michael's, he has served on the New Rector Search Committee, as a member of the vestry and as senior warden.
