In November we had a gathering at Emmanuel, Orlando for the Installation of the Most Rev. Sean Rowe as the new Presiding Bishop. In December we had a lunch gathering at Seasons 52 in Altamonte

Springs. We were also honored to attend the ordinations to the priesthood of the Rev. Jim Christoph at St. Richard's, Winter Park and the Rev. Stephanie Soper at Ascension, Orlando.

Deanery Ministry

Our Deanery began 2024 with a Clericus hosted at St. Mary's and led by Bishop Dabney Smith. Bishop Dabney wanted to use it as an opportunity to call us to focus on becoming more interrelated as clergy in the Diocese. It was a well-attended event, and everyone enjoyed our time together. We also discussed Outreach dollars and shared projects that we could participate in. At our next Clericus we decided as a deanery to allocate shared funds for the purpose of strengthening three local ministries: Kairos Outside, Grandparents Raising Grandchildren of Volusia County, and Barracks of Hope.

Two other Deanery events were held in the fourth quarter, one was a Healing and Forgiveness Workshop held in mid-October at St. Barnabas in Deland featuring The Rev. Rose Sapp-Bax as the guest speaker and then in early November, St. Mary's Daytona Beach held a Grieving

Through the Holidays program with an Intro to Walking the Mourner's Path led by Connie Wilson and Simone Hoover.

On November 8th, all of the active Clergy in the Deanery were invited to a special dinner event at Chucherias in Daytona Beach. This meal was scheduled at the request of Bishop Dabney, who passed before the event was held. We used the time to continue to build our relationships with each other, which was one of his great desires for the Diocese of Central Florida. The evening began with a prayer and a toast in Bishop Dabney's honor offered by our former Dean, The Rev. Fr. Roy Allison of St. James, Ormond Beach.

Deanery Ministry

In 2024 the Northwest Deanery of the Diocese of Central Florida offered three deanery-wide training events for meeting Continuing Education requirements. These training events were ecumenical, organized by the Dean of the Society of the Holy Trinity, a Lutheran Order under the leadership of the Dean and Priest-in-Charge at St. Frances Episcopal Church in Bushnell, Fr. Lawrence Recla. The participants are mostly Lutheran priests and deacons with Episcopal clergy regularly in attendance. Parishioners and spouses were also welcome to attend these retreats.

Three retreats were offered in 2024, one in March, one in June and one in November: The March retreat topic was Developing Character, Reflections from Aristotle, Ignatius of Loyola, and Others led by The Rev. Dr. Wollom Jensen. The June retreat was by The Rev. Dr. John Eric

Hurtgen, Dean, School of Theology, Campbellsville University. The November retreat was led by The Right Rev. Matthew L. Riegel, Bishop, West Virginia-Western Maryland Synod, ELCA.

The retreats were held at San Pedro in Winter Park and included opportunities to build community among the clergy of the Northwest Deanery. The lectures given at each retreat provided 4.25 hours of Continuing Education.

Fr. Matthew Perreault of St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Eustis led our Deanery in a Book Study of the Book, "Growing Young: Six Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church" by Kara Powell, Jake Mulder, et al. Together we met monthly on a Zoom call, offering prayer requests, sharing and discussing the book, chapter by chapter. The study continues.

Two Clericus gatherings were held at St. Mary's, Belleview in 2024. The first was held in April with our guest, The Right Rev. Dabney Smith. The second was held in November.

Lilly Grant Report

Lilly Grant funds designated for Continuing Education were used to provide scholarships for all clergy and spouses to attend the retreats at San Pedro, which included the lectures, the worship and room and board for one night and a day.

Lilly Grant funds designated for Outreach were used to support Deacon John Clark's mission in Beliz, "No One Hungry." Funds were allocated to help to build a kitchen there.

In addition, the Northwest Deanery supported Fr. James Giles and "Gateway to Hope," a feeding ministry in Ocala.

Finally, the Northwest Deanery supported the Kairos ministry – both the men's and women's at Sumpter and Lowell, as well as Kairos Outside.

- (2) Host a program on C.S. Lewis by The Rev. Andrew Lazo;
- (3) Host a diocesan-wide ecumenical all-day preaching seminar and luncheon featuring Andrew McGowan (Dean and President of Berkeley Divinity School and McFaddin Professor of Anglican Studies and Pastoral Theology), Joy J. Moore (Professor of Biblical Preaching, Luther Seminary and Co-host of the Sermon Brainwave Podcast), Khalia J. Williams (Associate Dean of Worship and Spiritual Formation; Associate Professor in the Practice of Worship; Co-Director of the Baptist Studies Program), and Will Willimon (Professor of the Practice of Christian Ministry, Duke Divinity School).
